Lectio Divina

January 4th 2026 2nd Sunday of Christmas – Year A – John 1:1 - 18

¹⁻¹In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²The same was in the beginning with God. ³All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. 4In him was life; and the life was the light of men. ⁵And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not. ⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all men through him might believe. 8He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light. ⁹That was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world. 10He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. 11He came unto his own, and his own received him not. 12But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: 13Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth. ¹⁵John bare witness of him, and cried, saying, This was he of whom I spake, He that cometh after me is preferred before me: for he was before me. ¹⁶And of his fulness have all we received, and grace for grace. ¹⁷For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No man hath seen God at any time, the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.

- Read and re-read out loud and slowly the Gospel.
- Meditate on reading as being spoken to you, an experience in your life.
- **Pray -** Thanksgiving Repentance Petition.
- Action Attitude (Call to change / to act /to do).

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This week's gospel is a very deep teaching on the Incarnation. We read about the vocation of John the Baptist who came as a witness to speak for the light so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. The word was the true light that enlightens all men and he was coming into the world.

In our lives what kind of witness to Jesus do we give to those around us? Would our lives encourage people to want to find our more about Jesus and why he means so much to us?

Prayer:

Thank You Lord for the deep moments when we realised through our meditation of your word in the Bible that our lives are better when we try to live with you as our guide.

Forgive us Lord for the times when we did not listen to your word and looked in other places for the answer to our problems even though you have told us "You are the way, the truth and the light."

Help us Lord to live and believe the message of the Incarnation. Because God became human he knows what it is to be human and shows us the way to become like him. He tells us "Do not be afraid, I am with you always."
