December 27th 2020 Sunday Feast of The Holy Family - Year B - Luke 2:22 - 40

In this week's Gospel we see Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the temple for purification as it was the law of Moses that every first born male must be consecrated to the lord and also to offer in sacrifice a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons. Also in the temple was a very good devout man called Simeon who was told by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he set eyes on Christ the Lord. He was led by the Spirit to the temple and when the parents arrived with the baby he took Jesus in his arms and blessed God. Many good things happened in the temple at that time, a time when priests were absent. Simeon and Anna are symbols of God's faithful people with no official status, free enough to recognise a great moment of grace.

As children of the family of God are we open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit to bring the Good News and hope of the Child Jesus to all or are we so full of our own importance that we miss our special moments of grace?
