## May 26th 2024 Feast of Most Holy Trinity Year B - Matthew 28: 16 - 20

<sup>28-16</sup> Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup>When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup>And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup>Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup>and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

- Read and re-read out loud and slowly the Gospel.
- Meditate on reading as being spoken to you, an experience in your life.
- Pray Thanksgiving Repentance Petition.
- Action Attitude (Call to change / to act /to do).
