### June 1<sup>st</sup> 2014 Feast of the Ascension of The Lord - Year A - Matthew 28: 16 - 20

In this week's gospel we see Jesus inviting his eleven disciples to meet him on the mountain for a chat. Some fell down before him but other hesitated. He told them to go out and make disciples of all nations. He said "I am with you always until the end of time", so take courage and do as I have taught you.
