- Meditate on reading as being spoken to you, an experience in your life

Action – Attitude (Call to change / to act / to do)

June 23rd 2013 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year C – Luke 9:18 - 24

In this week's gospel Jesus asks the question "Who do the crowds say I am?" Jesus also speaks about the difficulties his chosen path will bring him but he is confident that he will eventually be victorious.
