July 28th 2019 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time - Year C - Luke 11:1 - 13

In this week's gospel we see the disciples asking Jesus to teach them to pray because they had witnessed him in prayer. He taught them the Our Father. He also told his disciples that persistence always pays off. Three times he said the word "always". The one who asks always receives, the one who searches always finds, the one who knocks always has the door opened to him.

How do we pray? Do we get tired of asking for what we want instead of seeing that our prayer is always answered in the way Jesus thinks is best for us which we often only appreciate later on in life sometimes years on. Maybe we will not understand until we meet with Jesus when we will see the whole picture

Prayer:
