In this week's gospel we see Jesus teaching on excessive greed. When the man asks Jesus to tell his brother to give him a share in his inheritance Jesus refuses to get involved asking "who appointed me your judge or the arbitrator of your claims" He then tells him a parable about storing up of goods for himself instead of storing up treasure for himself in the sight of God.
