Treasures of Irish Christianity – "People and Places, Images and Texts"

is the title of a new book launched this week in St Patrick's College Maynooth by Christy Kenneally. The book is a collection of 80 short articles written by a host of leading scholars from the worlds of history, liturgy, theology, philosophy, art history and Celtic studies. The articles reflect on aspects of Christian tradition in Ireland from the fifth to the twenty-first century. Taking its cue from the theme of the 50th International Eucharistic Congress, which took place in Ireland from the 10th – 17th June last, this collection places special emphasis on the relationship between Irish people and the Eucharist.
