READINGS

A reading from the book of Proverbs (Pr 8:22-31)

The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose
first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly
set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not,
when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the
mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made
the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he
fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of
the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the
springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries
— and the waters will not invade the shore — when he laid down the
foundations of the earth,

I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at
play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with
the sons of men. The word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 8:4-9)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans. (Rm 5:1-5)

this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's
glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our
sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience
brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not
deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. (Jn 16:12-15)

to come. He will glorify me since all he tells you will be taken from what is
