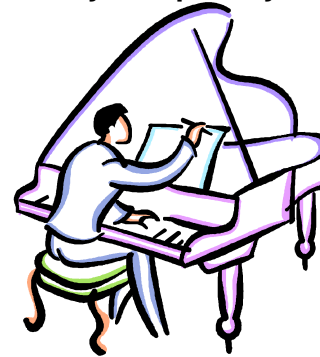
Today's gospel is an account of the ministry of Jesus and contains several messages that are important and helpful to us.
