A reading from the prophet Jeremiah. (Jer 23:1-6)

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks! 'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity.' *The word of the Lord* **Thanks be to God**

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians. (Eph 2:13-18)

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far apart from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father. *The word of the Lord* **Thanks be to God**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. (Mk 6:30-34)

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, 'You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while'; for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to

Message from Fr Pat McKinley - July 2024

Dear parishioners,

Most of you will have heard that the Archbishop has asked me to take on pastoral responsibility for St Jude's Parish, along with my current responsibilities in St Pius X. This change will take place from early September when Fr Brendan begins his sabbatical time from ministry. This will be a permanent appointment for the duration of my time in this area. Running one parish is a busy, full-time role already. Taking responsibility for two busy parishes, is daunting, but I am trusting the Lord, the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the on-going support and prayer of all of you as we discern new ways to deepen the bonds of friendship and mutual support between our two parishes. It will mean some changes in how we do things in both parishes.... I haven't developed the power of bilocation just yet!! I have met with both parish councils in the last few weeks to begin to plot a way forward together.

A time of significant change such as this causes uncertainty and challenge for us all. I don't have all the answers. We are blessed with excellent staff and volunteers in both of our parishes, and this will allow us to use this new situation as a time of opportunity too.... the opportunity to continue to build our Christian community together in

the parishes of Templeogue in these new, challenging and exciting times.
