Message from Archbishop Farrell about the Summer Dues Initiative

Our readings at Mass today focus, for Corpus Christy, on Priesthood and the Eucharist. The people following Jesus were tired and hungry (Luke 9:11-17). They Were in need of Nourishment and healing, at every level. Give them something to eat yourselves, Jesus says to the Twelve, but they were at a loss. They had very little , just five loaves and two fish. The miracle recounted is that from what little they had, Jesus made so much.

The call to ministry and to participation in the Eucharist is central to the life and wellbeing of the Christian community. We are grateful for our priests and for the service they offer. From what each one has, they pass on all we have received from the Lord (I Corinthians 11:23), and bring his healing presence and love alive. Gathered around Christ, and through the gift of his Spirit, each parish and partnership of parishes is called to mission.

READINGS

A reading from the book of Genesis. (Gen 14:18-20)

Melchizedek king of Salem brought bread and wine; he was a priest of God Most High. He pronounced this blessing: 'Blessed be Abraham by God Most High, creator of heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High for handing over your enemies to you. And Abraham gave him a tithe of everything. *The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 109:1-4)

R You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old.

The Lord's revelation to my Master: 'Sit on my right:

I will put your foes beneath your feet.' R

The Lord will send from Zion your sceptre of power:

rule in the midst of all your foes. R

A prince from the day of your birth on the holy mountains;

from the womb before the daybreak I begot you. R

The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change.

'You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old.' R

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians. (1 Cor 11:23-26) This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death. *The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*

Sequence (short form)

Behold the bread of angels, sent for pilgrims in their banishment, the bread for God's true children meant, that may not unto dogs be given. Oft in the olden types foreshowed; in Isaac on the altar bowed, and in the ancient paschal food, and in the manna sent from heaven.

Come then, good shepherd, bread divine, still show to us thy mercy sign; Oh, feed us still, still keep us thine; so may we see thy glories shine in fields of immortality; O thou, the wisest, mightiest, best, our present food, our future rest, come, make us each thy chosen guest, co-heirs of thine, and comrades blest with saints whose dwelling is with thee.

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the living bread which has come down from heaven, says the Lord. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.

Alleluia!

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke. (Lk 9:11-17)

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing. It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down.

Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets. *The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.*
